## Overview:

- Scoutmasters from the stake teach Senior Patrol Leaders, Patrol leaders and other Deacon age youth how to lead a successful youth lead Boy Scout program
- Boy Scouting is the approved Church program for young men ages 12-13
- There is significant unit specific interaction between youth and his Scoutmaster throughout the training session; it is important that the adults attend with their youth.
- How to seamlessly integrate the Duty to God Program with the Troop program
- Long range program planning
- Completion of this course qualifies the Youth to wear the “Trained” patch

## Who Should Attend – Youth:

- Senior Patrol Leaders, Patrol Leaders, Deacon Quorum Presidents, Deacon age youth
  - Who have not taken the training
  - Who have received a new calling in the Deacons’ quorum
  - Who have been recently appointed Troop Senior Patrol Leader or Patrol Leaders
  - Annually thereafter

## Who Should Attend – Adults

- Scoutmaster or his assistant needs to be preset each time one of the Deacons is attends
- New adults to program

## Adults who should attend at least once:

- Bishop/Branch President
- Bishopric/Presidency member with responsibilities for Deacons
- YM presidency member with responsibilities for Deacons
- Troop committee members
- Deacon’s quorum advisor
- Interested parents and other adults
